ORDER SCHEDULING ORAL ARGUMENT

Plaintiffs/Appellants' Motion for Oral Argument is granted. The case is set for oral argument before the Court *en banc* commencing at 1:30 p.m. on April 2, 2024, in the Courtroom of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, located on the second floor of the State Capitol.


Plaintiffs/Appellants will have 30 minutes to present oral argument. Following this, Defendants/Appellees will have 30 minutes to present oral argument. Plaintiffs/Appellants may reserve a portion of their 30 minutes for rebuttal. The Justices may ask questions during or after each argument.

Each party is directed to file, no later than March 19, 2024, a notice to the Court providing the name(s) of counsel who will be arguing the case, the name(s) of other counsel at the counsel table, and the allocation of their argument time, if applicable.

Attorneys may sit at the counsel table only if they have entered an appearance in the case.

The oral argument will be livestreamed and real-time closed captions will be displayed on the livestream. The videos and the closed captions are not a part of the official record in the case, and transcripts will not be created. The videos of oral arguments before the Oklahoma Supreme Court may be made available for viewing for the convenience of the public by a link on the OSCN website. The videos may be removed one year after the date of that oral argument. Copies of these videos shall not be produced or distributed by the Administrative Office of the Courts or other Court personnel.
